

Rechargeable Hearing Aid Batteries

Two manufacturers have recently introduced hearing aids using lithium-ion rechargeable batteries. But with the stories in the news about other lithium-ion batteries catching fire, Wake Audiology would like to gather more information before recommending this new battery technology. Older types of rechargeable hearing aid batteries have not been satisfactory, so they are used by only a few patients who cannot handle conventional batteries due to limited dexterity or poor vision.



ZPower battery manufacturer offers a rechargeable silver-zinc battery that can be retrofitted to a few styles of standard hearing aids. However, some hearing aid manufacturers will not honor the hearing aid warranty if the aid is retrofitted, so this is a limiting factor. Please let us know if you would like more information about either of these options.
